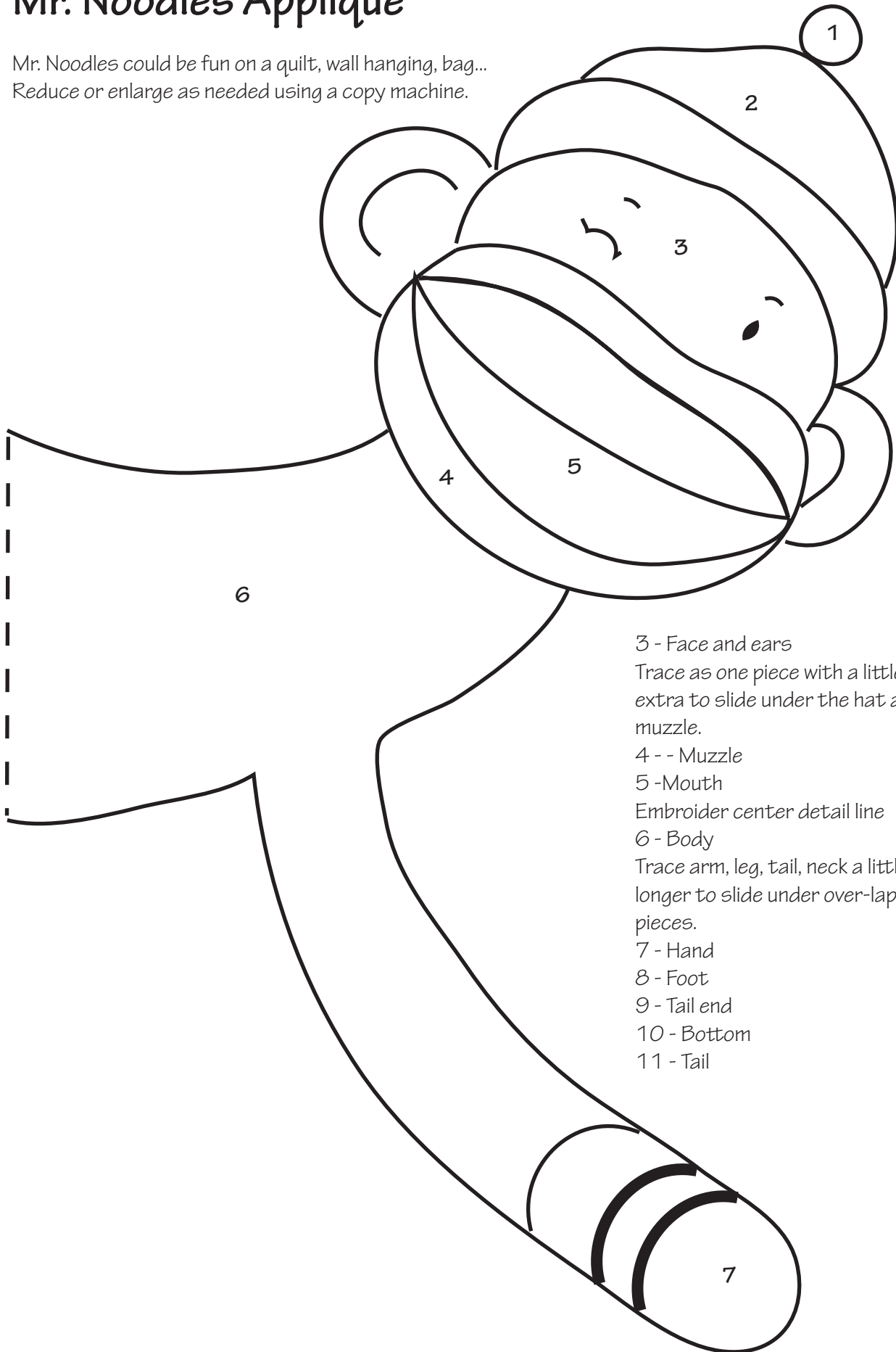
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Mr. Noodles Applique

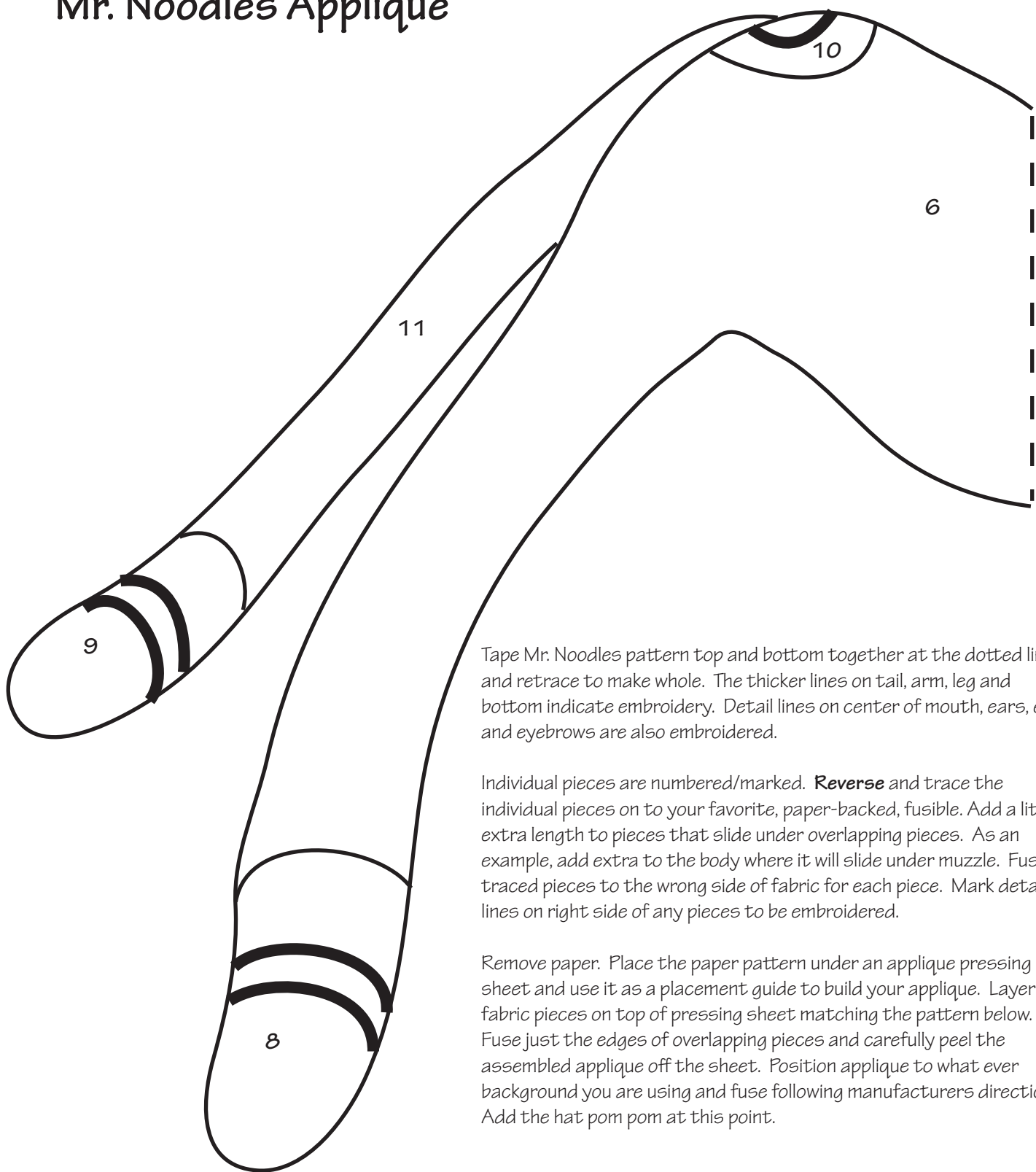
Mr. Noodles could be fun on a quilt, wall hanging, bag...
Reduce or enlarge as needed using a copy machine.



1 - Pom Pom
2 - Hat
Trace as one piece and embroider detail line

3 - Face and ears
Trace as one piece with a little extra to slide under the hat and muzzle.
4 - Muzzle
5 - Mouth
Embroider center detail line
6 - Body
Trace arm, leg, tail, neck a little longer to slide under over-lapping pieces.
7 - Hand
8 - Foot
9 - Tail end
10 - Bottom
11 - Tail

Mr. Noodles Applique



Tape Mr. Noodles pattern top and bottom together at the dotted lines and retrace to make whole. The thicker lines on tail, arm, leg and bottom indicate embroidery. Detail lines on center of mouth, ears, eyes and eyebrows are also embroidered.

Individual pieces are numbered/marked. **Reverse** and trace the individual pieces on to your favorite, paper-backed, fusible. Add a little extra length to pieces that slide under overlapping pieces. As an example, add extra to the body where it will slide under muzzle. Fuse traced pieces to the wrong side of fabric for each piece. Mark detail lines on right side of any pieces to be embroidered.

Remove paper. Place the paper pattern under an applique pressing sheet and use it as a placement guide to build your applique. Layer fabric pieces on top of pressing sheet matching the pattern below. Fuse just the edges of overlapping pieces and carefully peel the assembled applique off the sheet. Position applique to what ever background you are using and fuse following manufacturers directions. Add the hat pom pom at this point.
